

We have received a communication via the Community Foodbank and Calderwood Baptist Church inviting us as a Parish to become involved in a Warm Places Network and the development of a Poverty Alliance. We have readily agreed to participate in this and will give more details as they become available.

WEEKDAY MASSES

You will notice the change in Masses/services in the coming week. This allows me to travel to a residential retreat with some 4th and 5th Year Pupils. In years past, there would have been plenty of priests to cover weekday Masses, but this is not the case now. It is something for us to get used to, but it is a sacrifice I ask you to make to allow me to spend time with the primary and secondary schools. So, at the beginning of October, I will travel to Rome with 6th years, which will again affect weekday services. These residential events can be great opportunities for a chaplain. Hence, the sacrifice the weekday parishioners make in occasionally not having a weekday Mass is for the sake of our young people. The same might happen when the primaries have their residential trips for P7.
