

COMINGS AND GOINGS

Fr Frank's ordination date will be Saturday 9th March at St Peter's Ardrossan. His final Sunday Masses will be the weekend of 28th January.

He will then go on holiday for a week and leave the parish sometime during the week beginning 4th February.

The new Parish Priest will be in place by Sunday 11th February, just before the beginning of Lent. Please keep both in your prayers.

THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

The Christmas Season continues this week with the Epiphany. This comes from a word that means "manifestation". This is the day when the Lord is made manifest (is shown) to the whole world represented by the Magi, the outsiders.

Their gifts have an important symbolism:

- Gold a gift worthy of a king. The child born in the stable is recognised as the rightful king.
- Frankincense a gift for God. Incense continues to be used around sacred things (such as during benediction) and so this gift points to Christ's divinity.
- Myrrh a gift that reflects the cross. This is an ointment used to prepare bodies for burial. Right from the beginning of his life, we are directed towards his death. Christ came in order to die on the cross for our sake and rise again so that we might share in his resurrection.
